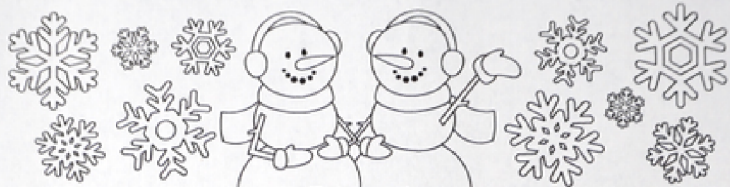

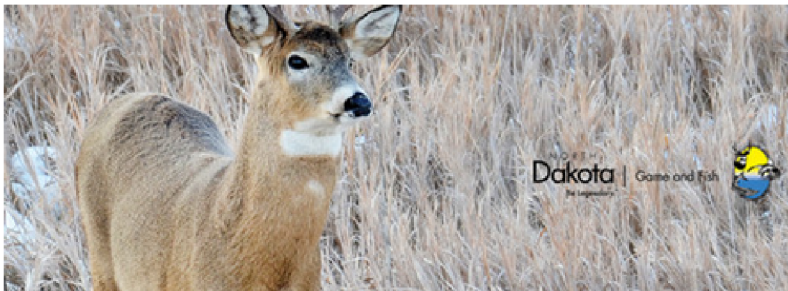

Wildlife Feeding Concerns

Tough winter conditions thus far in North Dakota have some citizens concerned about the stress on wildlife. Kevin Kading, state Game and Fish Department private land section leader, said harsh winters often generate conversations and questions about feeding wildlife, particularly deer and pheasants.

The department does not promote winter feeding and does not have a winter-feeding program, Kading said. We recognize that many people care deeply about wildlife, and it can be difficult to watch nature play out, but feeding operations, good intentions and all, can actually do more harm for wildlife than good.

Supplemental winter feeding does not benefit entire populations. Individuals and smaller groups of animals may receive some benefit, but often there are negative impacts such as congregating animals, drawing animals from long distances and away from good winter cover, increased predation, disease concerns, spreading of noxious weeds and feeding costs.

A poorly conducted feeding operation can kill more animals than it helps. For example, feeding animals on or near roadways can lead to wildlife-vehicle collisions. Providing feed that is too hot for deer, such as corn, which is high in sugars and starch, can lead to acidosis, rumenitis and ultimately death. And even individuals with the best of intentions who start feeding wildlife early in the winter often stop due to the amount of time and expense required, leading to the loss of animals that have become dependent on the handouts.

While its not uncommon for wildlife to die from exposure to cold, they rarely die from starvation. Knowing this, the department promotes habitat development that can provide critical winter thermal cover. Food plots should also be considered and planted near adequate winter cover. One alternative to feeding wildlife is for landowners, wildlife clubs and others to plow open areas of harvested grain or row crop fields to allow animals access to waste grains and other materials. These areas are also the first to melt when there is a break in the weather.

WRT Scholarships Due March 1, 2023

WRT 2023 scholarship applications are now available online at www.westriv.com. WRT provides internet, voice, and security services to 25 local communities in North Dakota and South Dakota. Area students are encouraged to apply for the \$1,000 WRT Scholarships, as well as the \$2,500 WRT-sponsored industry scholarships.

The 2023 WRT Scholarships include one \$1,000 scholarship per each of the seven WRT districts and one \$1,000 WRT Technology Scholarship to a student entering a technology-related field, such as telecommunications, electronics and computer technology, network systems administration, network and communications management, information technology and web development. In addition, students that are the dependent of a WRT employee or director are also eligible for a separate \$1,000 scholarship.

WRT scholarships are available to high school seniors who will be graduating this spring, as well as students in college/postsecondary institutions. WRT Scholarships are only available to current WRT members and/or their dependents. *(A member is defined as someone who receives phone &/or internet service from WRT.)* Students can reapply each year but may only receive the scholarship once.

Area students are also encouraged to apply for the WRT sponsored NTCA/ Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) College Scholarship Program. This telecommunications industry program offers graduating high-school seniors a chance at \$2,500 scholarships. Applicants must receive local service from and be sponsored by WRT. Preference will be given to individuals expressing an interest to return to a rural community following graduation.

The 2023 WRT Scholarship application is available online on WRT's website at <https://westriv.com/scholarship-application/>. Application deadline is March 1, 2023. The NTCA/FRS scholarship application is due February 8, 2023, and is available online at <https://www.frs.org/programs/youth-programs/scholarships>.

Winter weather tips!

When the weather outside gets frightful, not all of us have the option of staying home by the fire because we do have places to go. So when it snow, snow, snows, and you have places to go, make sure you've done a trunk transfer to be sure you'll be prepared if you get stuck in the cold.

The trunk is the perfect place to store all sorts of goodies that think we may need when we're out and about. But what we carry and what we need if we get stuck in the elements can vary.

Nearly 1 in 5 of yearly weather-related crashes occur on snowy, slushy, or icy pavement. Approximately 70% of the US populations lives in a region that receives five or more inches of snow each year. With winter storms and heavy snows in the forecast, State Farm encourages drivers to prepare their vehicles for safe travel as road conditions become hazardous.

Some items to check and talk to your mechanic about before a storm:

Test the battery strength.

Check the cooling system, windshield wiper and antifreeze fluid levels and change the oil.

Consider changing the spark plugs.

Check the tire pressure, tread life and consider installing winter tires.

Locate the spare tire, jack and ice scraper.

Inspect your wiper blades to make sure they're functional and in good condition.

Creamy Chicken Noodle Soup with Rotisserie Chicken

2 tbsp unsalted butter, 1 tbsp olive oil,
2 cups chopped yellow onion, 1 cup chopped carrots,
1 cup chopped celery, 1 ¾ tsp kosher salt,
3 tbsp all-purpose flour. 4 cups unsalted chicken stock,
2 cups whole milk. 4 ozs uncooked whole-wheat egg noodles,
3 cups coarsely chopped rotisserie chicken breast,
1 cup frozen green peas

Melt butter with olive oil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Add onion, carrots, celery & salt and cook, stirring often, until vegetables are slightly softened, 6 to 8 minutes. Add flour and stir to coat. Stir in broth and milk and let mixture come to a boil. Add uncooked noodles to boiling mixture. Cover and cook until noodles are al dente, about 8 minutes. Stir in chicken and peas and cook until pasta reaches desired doneness and chicken and peas are warmed through, about 1 to 2 more minutes.

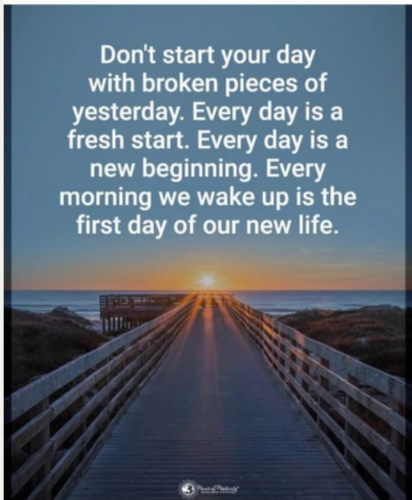

City Council Meeting December 12, 2022

The regular Riverdale City Council meeting of December 12, 2022 was called to order at 6:00 by Mayor Taylor.

Present: Alex Taylor, Garth Zimbelman (via phone), Dave Fryda, Mike Dirk, Dick Cheatley and Auditor Del Kolke

Cheatley moved to approve consent agenda items. Fryda seconded.

Motion carried.

Hearings: Building inspector provided an inspection report and pictures of the building located on Lot 3 Block 2 Monroe Addition noting items not in compliance with city zoning ordinances and ND Building Codes.

Dirk moved to deny request of Mr. Bertsch to allow this property to be utilized as residential space. Cheatley seconded. Roll Call: Zimbelman aye, Fryda aye, Dirk aye, Cheatley aye. Motion carried. Dirk moved to revoke previously approved water and sewer services until building code violations are brought into compliance. Cheatley seconded. Roll Call: Zimbelman aye, Fryda aye, Dirk aye, Cheatley nay. Motion carried.

Discussion transitioned to the ditch at 407 Dakota Avenue. City engineer explained the purpose of a ditch is water conveyance and the current status does not allow proper drainage. Mr. Tuck will recommend a solution to the situation.

The hearing for Iron Oar is tabled until January. Auditor will request body cam footage from November 6th incident.

Guest:

AJ Tuck, Moore Engineering, has submitted application to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund for potential funding of the remaining sewer line of approximately two (2) miles to lagoon to be relined. DL Barkie has completed 21 gates valves of Phase I and suspended work for the season. Cheatley moved to approve Pay Request No. 1 for \$341,444.22. Zimbelman seconded. Motion carried. Dirk moved to approve the plans and specs for Phase II gate valve improvements and authorize Moore Engineering to bid the project. Fryda seconded.

Motion carried. Fryda moved to advertise the project for bidding. Cheatley seconded. Motion carried. Cheatley moved to authorize auditor and mayor to sign necessary paperwork for grant and loan applications. Dirk seconded. Motion carried. City representation at the February 9 Dakota Water Resource meeting is encouraged.

Old Business: Continued research of rehabilitation costs of Plaza Building I are being gathered to provide information to determine fate of the structure.

Reports:Fire Dept. has winterized trucks.

Taylor reported a water break on a vacant portion of a residential lot located south of Missouri Drive on 3rd Street which has been repaired. Dirk has visited with Dave Beck, Corps of Engineers, and has been reassured rip rap delivery will not occur until after January 1 and Missouri Drive roadbed should be better able to withstand heavy truck traffic. Corps of Engineers has stated they will repair any damages incurred.

Cheatley noted pump and motor issues continue to be a concern as they are reaching end of service age.

City hall may be closed Dec. 16-19. City employees will not be working Dec. 23 & Dec. 26 for the Christmas holiday and Jan. 2 for New Year's. Next meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 9 at 6:00 PM.Meeting adjourned at 8:05 PM.
